Ex-students mark school history

MORE than 100 years of education were celebrated with the formation of the Bourne Academy Alumni Association.

The event was attended by former staff and students of the academy and its previous incarnations under the school names East Howe, Kingsleigh and Kings High.

The evening was opened by three speakers who had gone to the Bournemouth school: Ray Cozins, a pupil at East Howe School during the Second World War, whose father, George, was one of the first pupils in 1912; David Bennett, barrister and liaison adviser to the South West General Medical Council; and Celia Sawyer, Channel 4's Four Rooms expert, interior designer and winner at the Inspiration Awards for Women 2013.

Joan Drew, who attended East Howe Girls School from 1954-58, said: "It

was nice to hear how David Bennett and Celia Sawyer have succeeded after attending the school. I was pleased to see the social skills the young students had whilst showing us the much improved facilities since 1958.

"The students were a credit to themselves and the Bourne Academy."

She added: "The students were quite shocked to hear we received the cane and slipper if badly behaved, also the wooden board rubber had been known to travel through the air if the teacher felt the need."

Mrs Drew was part of a very successful athletics team and won the senior shield at the Town Annual Sports Day in 1958, the 11th consecutive year East Howe won it under the

guidance of Mrs Vardy.

Caroline Gobell, business director at the Bourne Academy, said: "We were absolutely thrilled to welcome over 100 former staff and students to launch our Alumni Association. There were so many stories to hear about on the night, people remembering school in their day and having the opportunity to meet new and old friends."
